### SUCCESS STORIES.

#### DREW FINDS ONGOING WORK WITH VIATEK

Drew says genU Employment Pathways helped him find a new job in a new town.

Drew grew up in Cobden, before moving to Geelong to pursue his passions in athletics and Australian rules football commentary. He realised he needed help in finding suitable employment, and with assistance from genU Employment Pathways, Drew soon landed a job with printing equipment supplier Viatek in Fyans Street.

"I needed something to do during the week so genU came along and helped me out, they got me a job at Viatek and it started from there," Drew said.

Drew linked up with genU Employment Pathways in 2018 and began fine-tuning his resume, working on interview practice and canvassing local employment opportunities. Employment Pathways Coordinator Dave worked alongside Viatek to build a role that suited Drew's specific skills. Dave and the employer worked closely to ensure the company was well equipped to support Drew in the workplace.

Drew's roles and tasks at Viatek have changed over time, as his skills and confidence grew.

"I do a few different things there as a technician, a bit of computer work, installs and a lot of travel too – it can be challenging but I love it, it's been really good," he said.

Drew said building a local support network which included genU, his family and his new employer Viatek, gave him increased confidence to build his employability skills.

"I think it's really important to have that support from all those areas," he said.

"There's a lot of people who taught me about what I needed to do – I wouldn't be in this position if it wasn't for them."

Drew said employment support was there for people who needed a helping hand.

"Just keep at it, get that support if you need it, and stay focused on the goals you want to achieve," he said.

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#### **CAITLIN SHINES GAINING CINEMA WORK EXPERIENCE**


Caitlin is one step closer to her career goal of working in a cinema after her work experience at <u>Thornbury Picture House</u>.

#### CAREER DREAMS BLOOM AT THE STATE ROSE GARDEN



Werribee Park and the State Rose Garden continue to blossom thanks to the hard work of some genU SLES participants!

Two groups from genU get work experience out at the rose garden one day a week, where they are guided to develop their horticulture skills.

Some of the tasks they do include pruning, planting, fertilising, watering and some light landscaping.

All the participants are working with their Employment Pathways coordinators to develop their employability skills and gain more experience in horticulture and gardening. This experience helps the participants to strive towards their career goals of gaining employment somewhere in the great outdoors!

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#### **RUBY'S COSTUME JOB A HUGE STEP FORWARD**

Since Ruby started with SLES last year, she's completed travel training and work placements at Woolworths, Big W, Target and Coles. This experience helped build her attention to detail, time-management skills and ability to take initiative.

These were big steps for Ruby, but her huge success came when she commenced work experience at The Costumery in October. Ruby is a big fan of cosplay and film making, and has great talent with hair dressing and make up design. So her support worker found something that was more suited to her interests and future prospects and organised the placement.

Now Ruby gets to complete various tasks including styling displays, pricing costumes and brushing wigs. She is also getting Individual Support to find suitable courses in the Hair and Beauty industry. Each week her confidence builds and her skills improve!





#### TIM COMPLETES WORK EXPERIENCE AT IGA

Tim has been excelling while completing work experience at IGA liquor.

With the help of the genU Employment Pathways team, Tim gained his Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) and secured work experience.

At IGA, he serves customers, unpacks and replenishes stock and does it all with a great attitude. He's really shown his communication skills and ability to take initiative!



### CLINT FINDS POSITIVE LEASE ON LIFE AFTER GAINING EMPLOYMENT

Qualified mechanic Clint engaged with genU Employment Pathways after a life-changing seizure left him with a brain injury.

The guidance and mentoring from Clint's Employment Pathways Coordinator helped him gain and maintain employment as a welder and general hand at Lifting Victoria.

Clint continues to be supported by genU and he remains positive and determined to keep his job.



#### CHRISTIAN ENCOURAGED TO EXPLORE HIS OPTIONS

Christian has been making great progress with his employability skills, after trying out a range of different placements.

Since starting with genU's Employment Pathways program in January 2020, Christian has completed placements in Woolworths, Big W and Rebel Sports. As he learns more about businesses, Christian is deciding on the type of work he might want to do in the future.

Christian is participating in a variety of group-based work experience placements with School Leaver Employment Supports (SLES), which

encourage him to learn various tasks and engage in different workplaces.

Christian's father is thrilled with his progress: 'Christian has already had so many different experiences, of which we are so thankful.'



#### PARTICIPANTS HELP COOK COMMUNITY MEALS

A partnership between the genU SLES team and community outreach organisation ADRA has helped to support community members in need.

genU SLES participants are developing their hospitality skills by preparing a three course meal each week to serve to community members in need of a meal. The SLES participants attend the Seventh Day Adventist Church weekly and are supported by genU Employment Pathways Practitioner — who also happens to be a qualified chef!

The team prepare a soup, main meal and dessert to give to those in need.





#### SARA FOLLOWS DREAMS WITH HOTEL PLACEMENT

Sara is finally following her dreams of securing employment within a reputable hotel.

Sara first came to genU Employment Pathways with the goal of filling her week up with meaningful activities and placements. She wanted to increase her independence and employability skills.

An Employment Pathways Coordinator worked closely with Sara on a comprehensive employment-focused discovery process. It was determined that Sara had a strong interest in increasing her social interaction, surrounding herself with likeminded individuals and gaining employment within the tourism industry — specifically within a hotel.

Sara attended a Groomed to Go workshop for business attire, travelled to Melbourne on public transport and attended an Information Interview with the Human Resource Manager at Marriott Hotels. They were impressed with Sara's experience, as she volunteers two days a week at Meals on Wheels,. This has allowed her to build strong working relationship with likeminded individuals, increase her confidence and develop her skills.

All this development has lead to Sara gaining a work placement at Quest Hotel as a 'Hotel Professional in Training'!







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#### KARLA'S DETERMINATION LANDS HER THE DREAM JOB

Karla has been boot scootin' her way across the floor after landing her dream job at Allingtons Outpost in South Australia — a country, work and western wear store.

The SLES participant successfully gained casual employment at Allingtons with help from genU.



#### DALLAS DEVELOPS INDEPENDENCE AT NEW PLACEMENT



Dallas completed his work placement at the Earth Village Café in Melton. As part of his School Leaver Employment Supports, Dallas has developed resilience, confidence and communication, enabling him to build on his employability skills.

Dallas now has the skills to work alongside his co-workers, as well as being able to take initiative and show his independence. He's been able to cope with situations that would have challenged him in the past, such as changes to the café layout.

#### LIAM LANDS NEW WORK PLACEMENT

Liam has gone from strength to strength after undertaking a range of work experience opportunities. He has been concentrating on developing various 'employability skills' including initiative, teamwork, productivity, timemanagement and attention to detail.

The dedicated SLES participant has had the opportunity to try out a number of different industries and attended work placements across Melbourne at Target, Big W, the fleet car carwash at the Austin Hospital and Woolworths.

Liam particularly enjoyed working in the warehouse at Target completing tasks such as processing and sorting deliveries and grouping products into stock cages. Through the support of his genU Employment Pathways Coordinator, Liam has also commenced a new work placement at Aussie Disposals in Dandenong where he is able to continue to develop his warehousing skills.
